

SIHI country hubs have been established worldwide to advance social innovation through the following key strategies: fostering research (facilitating the integration of research in the field of social innovation), capacity strengthening (providing learning resources, opportunities, and programmes), and advocacy (offering evidence-based insights on effective strategies).

Strategically situated within academic and research institutions, SIHI hubs serve as convening platforms for fostering collaboration and uniting social innovators, community members, healthcare system stakeholders, and donors. These hubs play a pivotal role by rigorously identifying and selecting promising social innovations, offering them essential research grants and technical support, and orchestrating comprehensive impact monitoring and evaluation research to ensure their efficacy and sustainability.
